

WHAT IS PUS IN URINE?

Pyuria is the condition of urine containing white blood cells or pus. Defined as the presence of 6-10 or more neutrophils per high power field of unspun, voided mid-stream urine. It can be a sign of a bacterial urinary tract infection.

CAUSES OF PUS IN URINE

Pyuria is a condition that occurs when excess white blood cells, or pus, are present in the urine. Pyuria causes cloudy urine and frequently indicates the presence of a urinary tract infection (UTI). Parasites, kidney stones, tumors and cysts, and interstitial cystitis can also lead to pyuria.

SYMPTOMS OF PUS IN URINE

- Frequent urination.
- Pain or burning when passing urine.
- Fever.
- Urine looks dark, cloudy, or reddish in color (blood may be present in the urine)
- Urine smells bad.
- Feeling pain even when not urinating.
- Tiredness.
- Pain in the back or side, below the ribs.
